General information about 5th Forum Decentralized Cooperation Romanian Belgium

The title of the 5th Forum Decentralized Cooperation Romania Belgium "25 years of commitment, dedication and engagement; 10 years of decentralized cooperation" clearly underlines the long tradition of collaboration between civil society organizations and public authorities from both countries.

Decentralized cooperation is a supportive partnership between foreign local and regional subnational organizations. Its main aim is to promote common prosperity and consolidate local development and territorial governance. Decentralized cooperation is considered as any project, initiative, or partnership among at least one Belgian and one Romanian sub-national organization (public authority, semi public, NGO, educational institute...) in order to promote sustainable local and regional development. This definition of decentralized cooperation clearly underlines that decentralized cooperation is not the same as decentralization. Decentralization means the transfer of authority and responsibility for public functions from the central government to subordinate or quasi-independent government organizations and/or the private sector. Different meanings and outcomes will be presented.

During the historical round table on Thursday November 5 2015, the 3 volumes about 175 years of diplomatic relations between Belgium and Romania, written by former Belgian Ambassador in Romania Philippe Beke, will be presented. Also some other lectures will give an insight in this not so very well know common histories between both countries. In the afternoon an exhibition about the famous Belgian comic strip Nero will be opened. This event is followed by the plenum on economic collaboration. During this plenum opportunities will be explored on the economical field. On Friday the Forum starts with some reflections on the Europe 2020 strategy and how this ambitious aims can be localized. Specific attention will go to the regional differences in reaching these goals. Further building on these concepts, umbrella organizations will discuss how local authorities can implement the international and European goals. The ideas developed during the morning plenary sessions will be further explored during the workshops in the afternoon sessions of Friday November 6 2015. To give participants the opportunity to have an in depth discussion during the workshops, each workshop will be held in 2 sessions of 1.5 hour each. But the focus of one session can be different so that a switch workshop is still possible.. Together with these workshops parliament members from both countries will gather to talk about: the relations between parliaments from both countries, the regionalization trend and working programs between both countries. On Saturday November 7 2015 the conclusions will be presented as a 2 year working agenda 2015-2017.





The Adventures of Nero is a Belgian comic strip drawn by Marc Sleen and the name of its main character. Nero is a Dutch language comic strip which appeared in Belgian newspapers between 1947 and 2002. Originally called The adventures of Detective Van Zwam, it quickly changed its name to The adventures of Nero after a character met by Van Zwam in the first adventure who was locked in an asylum and thought he was emperor Nero. He came quickly to his senses, but the name stuck and everyone referred to him as Nero ever since. An exhibition dedicated to this strip was created in Romanian by the Belgian Embassy in Romania.

Context	"Setting up a qualitative, accessible and affordable healthcare for everyone"
	Romania faces serious health problems that the healthcare system does not seem to be able to cope with. Poor health indicators such as high morbidity and mortality through tuberculosis, hepatitis B and C, cervical cancer, infant mortality, dramatically dropping of healthy life expectancy place Romania on the last places in Europe with regard to health showing the poor performance of its health system.
	In addition, citizens from rural communities are even more disadvantaged than those living in towns with regard to healthcare. They have less access to basic health services, lower insurance coverage and worse health outcomes than the ones living in urban areas. Health and social assistance services at grass roots level are in general severely underdeveloped. Doing nothing represents an enormous threat to the health of citizens in rural communities in general and to the chronic patients living in rural areas in particular. This will automatically lead to more expenses as well for the patients as for the state budget.

Context	"Building on a permanent cooperation and training between volunteers and professionals"
	In Romania the professional firefighters (ISU) are still a military structure and situated in bigger cities. In the past, practically all villages had a voluntary firefighters corps (SVSU) as well. The past years lot of firefighting trucks and other firefighting materials have been sent to partner villages and cities in Romania from Belgium out. Some Belgian committees also looked to really set up or activate again the voluntary fire brigades locally. The main idea is to get a good cooperation between ISU and SVSU and a common training lead by ISU. Doing that way, SVSU can be an ideal satellite post for ISU locally in order to start action immediately after alarming. There is a big willingness to further support such cooperation as well with exchange of trainings between Belgium and Romania as with additional interesting materials and utilities. Moreover a twinning between Belgian and Romanian firefighters can be set up. Also preventive actions locally as smoke detectors, evacuation plans schools, etc. should be set up as well as cooperation between firefighters and health centers.
